4. Hide layer 3 by poking it in the eye.





5. Set the Blending Mode of layer 2 to Overlay.

6. Desaturate layer 2 (make it black and white). Go to Enhance/Adjust Color/Remove Color (Shift+Ctrl+U).



7. Now, invert layer 2. Go to Filter/Adjustments/Invert (Control+I).



8. Add a Gaussian Blur to layer 2. Go to Filter/Blur/Gaussian Blur. Add a Radius to the blur of 50



9. Unhide layer 3 by poking it in the eye.



10. Select layer 3 and navigate to Filter/Other/High Pass. Select a Radius of 60 pixels.



Change the blending mode of layer 3 to Overlay and you are done. Feel free to tweek your
picture. If you would like moderate looking HDR reduce Opacity of the 3rd layer, if you'd like to
